December 22, 2019, Fourth Sunday of Advent & Christmas Bulletin

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign.

Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel."

Do you hold on to the promises of God at all times, especially when you are faced with uncertainty or adversity?

We always seem to be searching for something in our lives; it seems there is always something we are missing. Everyone wants to feel they belong, they need to be affirmed. We often look in wrong places and look to wrong people; we search for someone to tell us what we want to hear. We hear in the gospel this week that Mary also had to face an enormous challenge to her faith and trust in God, and to the faith of her family and Joseph, the man she chose to marry. She was asked to assume a burden of tremendous responsibility and great risk. Mary was not yet married and pregnancy outside of wedlock was not tolerated in those days and punishable by death. Mary was only espoused to Joseph, and such an engagement had to last for a whole year. She could have been rejected by Joseph, by her family, by all her own people. Mary knew that Joseph and her family would not understand without revelation from God. She nonetheless believed and trusted in God's promises. Throughout history, God has prepared people to encounter him. Angels and prophets, small boys and queens. Moses, Esther and Jonah all resisted God's invitation so we are in good company if we find it hard to imagine what role God has planned for us.

When the angel Gabriel came to Mary with the news of her becoming the mother of Jesus he had you and me in mind. When the angels appeared to the shepherds with news of peace for the entire world, God had you and me in mind. When the star over Bethlehem led the wise men to the stable, God had you and me in mind. God had a plan. That plan was perfectly timed to include you and me, so that in "in the fullness of time," we, too, came to be. It's all in accordance with God's plan. When we are faced with seemingly insurmountable problems God does not leave us alone. A baby is about to be born into our lives; we've spent the last number of weeks preparing, and preparing for the baby Jesus is like preparing for any other human babies in a way – we don't tell Jesus who he is. We don't define Jesus. We get to know him by listening and being in his presence. We hold him close and he tells us who he is. Blessings.

O Antiphons



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As we prepare for Christmas and the celebration of the birth of Christ. each Sunday of Advent we will begin our Mass with a member of the choir

singing the traditional O Antiphons. Antiphons are short psalm verses or sentences from Holy Scripture. The O Antiphons are the seven antiphons traditionally chanted during Evening Prayer. In the Roman tradition they are sung from December 17th to 23rd.

Each O Antiphon begins with a name of Christ taken from Scripture. They express the Church's longing and expectation for the coming Messiah.

- O Sapientia (O Wisdom)
- O Adonai (O Lord)
- O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse)
- O Clavis David (O Key of David)
- O Oriens (O Rising Sun)
- O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations) and
- O Emmanuel (God is with us).

The ordering of these antiphons is purposeful. Starting with the last O Antiphon and taking the first letter of each, the Latin words ero cras are formed meaning Tomorrow I will be there. This is the Good News of the Advent Season. The O Antiphons remind us of the joyful conclusion of our Advent preparation.
